Weekly News Bulletin: The 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time 15th October 2017—Yr A

This week's parable likens the kingdom of heaven *to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding'. Often in the Bible the rich symbolism of a wedding feast, with its abundance of wine, food and a union of love, is used to speak of God's taking final possession of his people. Here the symbol is directed not just to any wedding but to a wedding given by a king for his son.

The theme of Jesus being the son, sent by the Lord of the vineyard was the theme of last week's parable. The biblical image of the wedding feast, the traditional understanding of God as 'king' and Jesus' claims to be the one sent by God as his son, tell the reader that the presence of Jesus to his people is the moment of God's taking possession of his people.

There are so many excuses for not attending the wedding. As with the parable of the wicked vine- keepers, the king sends his servants, but they are rejected, as those invited have other interests: a farm or a business. Indeed, these other attractions are so powerful that the wedding seems to be a bit of a threat. The best way to escape this threat is to kill the messengers who bring the invitation. Once again, Israel's troubled relationship with God forms the background to the story of the servants of the king. Long have they maltreated and killed the servants, the prophets of the Lord.

But the king will always be the king. He will have the last word. Thus, his anger is roused, and the chosen guests are slain and their town is destroyed. In their place come "everyone you can find'. The wedding feast is no longer the gathering of a chosen people. It is the place where God takes possession of all peoples. The early Church, reading this story, looks back upon the destruction of Jerusalem and the beginnings of the mission of Christianity into the Gentile world as the fulfilment of this parabolic prophecy of Jesus.

But being chosen does not necessarily lead to the acceptance of the one who chose you. It is not good enough simply to be there. Someone comes in dirty clothing, symbolising a life that has undergone no change — not even for the wedding. The king approaches him and calls him 'friend', but receives no answer. This participant at the wedding has no desire to respond to the wishes of the king. He must be cast out. He has been called, but failed in his response to that call

Today's parable echoes the controversies between Jesus and his Jewish opponents, but it leads us beyond that debate. It shows us God's gracious calling of all of us from the highways and the by-ways into the richness which his life and love can offer. But it also warns us that Christian life is a web made up of interaction between God's gracious invitation and our free response. If our response does not take God's invitation seriously, it is already the wrong response.
