On the weekend 27-28 June, our parish will take up the annual Peter's Pence Collection as a retiring collection. This worldwide appeal enables the Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, to support the Church's charitable works and respond to those suffering from war, natural disasters, poverty, and other emergencies.

The tradition of Peter's Pence dates back many centuries, when the faithful offered financial support to the successor of St Peter for his ministry and care of those in need. Today, these contributions help the Pope provide assistance where it is most urgently required and support the mission of the Catholic Church.
